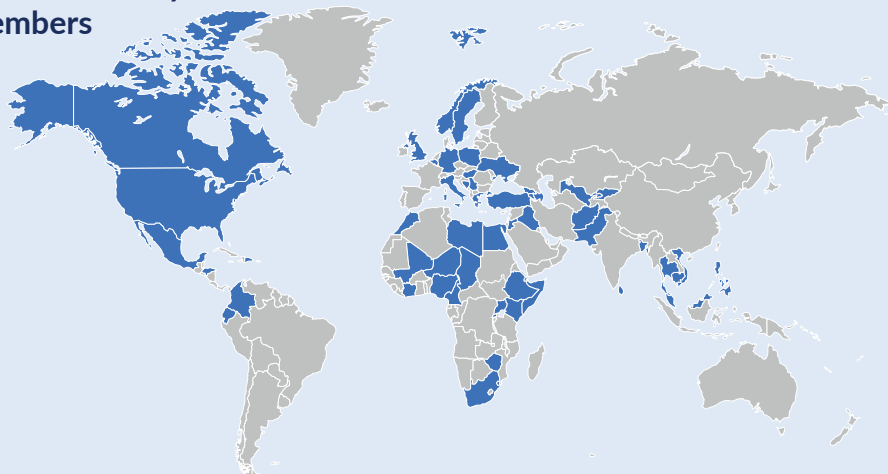
About EGRISS

The Expert Group on Refugee, IDP and Statelessness Statistics (EGRISS) is a UN Statistical Commission (UNSC) mandated, multi-stakeholder group that works with national statistical offices, international organizations and civil society to develop and support implementation of international standards and guidance to improve official statistics on forcibly displaced and stateless persons.

With 55 country members and 35 institutional partners comprising its membership, EGRISS welcomes collaboration with all relevant partners from the statistical community.

- Invest in methodological research to advance practice and inform tools
- Facilitate peer-to-peer learning and exchange of experiences at national, regional and international levels
- Develop statistical capacity through training and supporting countries to implement the Recommendations
