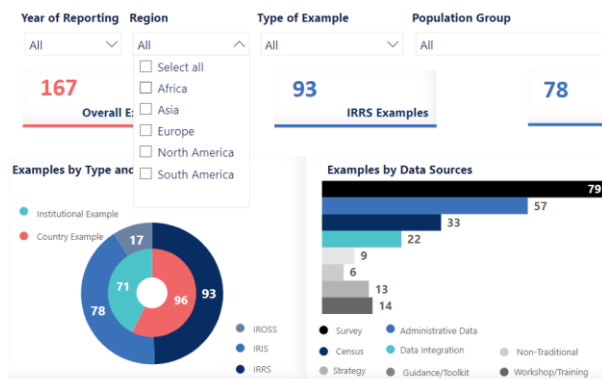

### New! GAIN survey results and dashboard

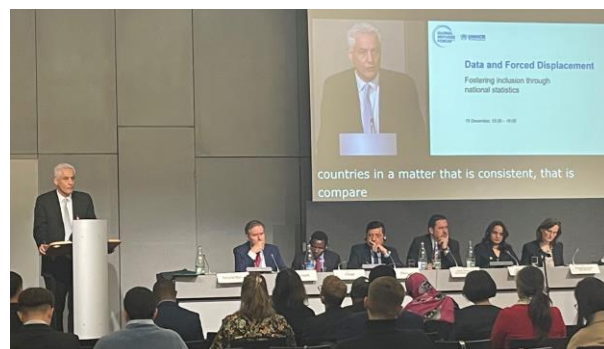

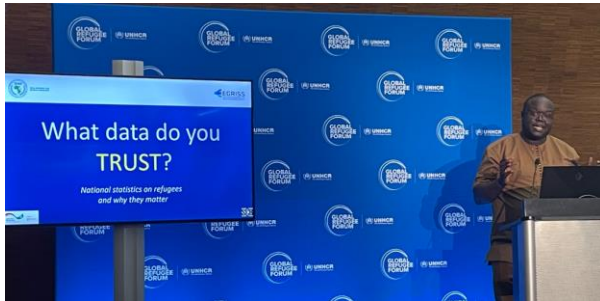
### Over 60 pledges on statistical inclusion

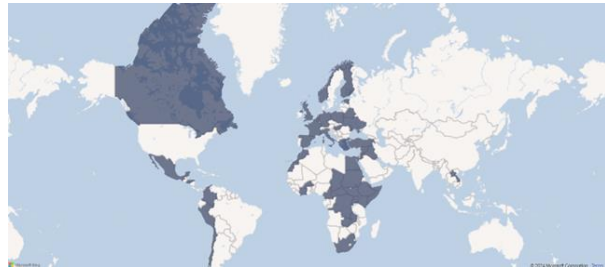

## Implementation examples

### 2023 global overview

EGRISS identified 57 examples using the International Recommendations on [Refugee \(IRRS\)](#), [IDP \(IRIS\)](#) and [Statelessness Statistics \(IROSS\)](#) in 2023. Examples include 30 country led examples (across 22 distinct countries) and 27 led by other stakeholders.

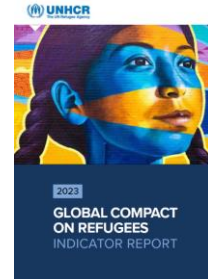

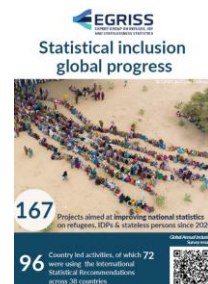

The Expert Group on Refugee, Internally Displaced Persons, and Statelessness Statistics (EGRISS) is a multi-stakeholder group mandated by the UN Statistical Commission to develop and support the implementation of international statistical recommendations on refugee, IDP, and statelessness statistics. EGRISS was established in 2016 and currently includes 57 countries and 37 institutional partners. The group aims to improve the quality and availability of official statistics on these populations by advocating for and supporting their inclusion in national statistical systems, to help ensure they are not left behind as countries work to achieve their development goals.
